CONFERENCE GUIDELINES

The first iteration of the Virginia Tech Model United Nations Conference, otherwise known as VTMUNC I, is committed to providing a safe and pleasurable experience for all delegates, advisors, and individuals involved with VTMUNC I. Although participating in Model UN is being involved in competitive activity, its fundamental purpose is to uphold and put into practice both the principles of diplomacy, collaboration, and cooperation. Any individual that violates the policies and procedures of VTMUNC I and the ideals of an open and inclusive environment will be subject to disciplinary action from the staff of VTMUNC I; disciplinary action may include a warning or being disqualified from receiving awards. Promoting an environment that is open to all by being safe, equitable, and exhilarating is our utmost priority. In order to ensure this, the following are **prohibited**:

1. Any pre-writing or working on committee content outside of VTMUNC I committee sessions (as described by the Schedule of Program).
2. Any speeches, directives, crisis arcs, or actions in committee that intend to create violence or promote a violent environment to a specific group of people, including mentions of sexual violence, graphic violence, and other behavior that is beyond committee guidelines.
3. Any hate speech, written documents, or behavior that uses language that is discriminatory and disrespectful, including but not limited to any language that is racist, sexist, homophobic, transphobic, xenophobic, antisemitic, Islamophobic, or language harmful to any specific group.
4. Any actions that are deliberate, both knowingly and intentionally, to bully, harass, or otherwise harmful behavior that may or has hurt other delegates' physical and or mental health.





BRIEF OVERVIEW OF CRISIS COMMITTEES

As the wise and bright minds of the world engage with knowledge of the unknown, new and innovative ways of thinking start to dominate the world. Said ways of thinking make the world what it is today: a cocktail of organized chaos or, what we like to call it, organized crisis. Unlike any conventional committee in the Model UN Circuit, Crisis Committees are unique spaces of debate which consist of continuous cycles of debate filled with uncertainty and, in the process, crisis. Their procedure differs from the procedure that committees in the General Assembly manage, having no formal motions to open debate nor speaker's lists to depend on. This causes crisis committees to resort to 3 styles of debate, which are:

1. Round Robins are a style of debate in which each delegate has a stipulated amount of time to express their opinions/thoughts with respect to the current crisis situation. The delegate proposing the motion to round robin will have the right to stipulate the amount of time each delegate has to speak (equally). It is recommended that round robins be executed at the beginning of the committee or when there are major crisis updates throughout the committee.
2. Moderated Caucuses consist of a specific topic of discussion, a duration, and a speaking time per delegate. These will have chairs individually calling delegates to speak in the debate, be a default if the chair doesn't exercise a round robin motion, and managed in continuous rolling cycles throughout the debate.
3. Unmoderated Caucuses, on the other hand, are a style of debate which focuses more on free discussion and flow of debate between delegates without a necessity to conduct a motion to structure speech. Delegates will have full autonomy of how much times they speak in the unmoderated caucus and will be able to chat with other delegates relative to the topic being discussed.

I hope you all are as excited as I am in participating in this committee. We have all worked so very hard, and I am already so proud of each and every one of you. Over the weekend I am so very excited to see how you all will solve the "Trouble in the Dreamhouse."

BRIEF HISTORY OF BARBIE DOLL

Barbie was created by a woman named Ruth Handler in the year 1959. Being a mother, Handler was inspired to make Barbie after watching her daughter play with paper. Her daughter often projected her hopes and dreams onto her dolls, and Handler, being the visionary she was, recognized there were holes in the market. Most toy manufacturers only marketed baby dolls to young girls. Handler wondered "what if I created a doll for little girls to imagine themselves as something other than future mothers." Thus, Barbie was born. When playing with Barbie, girls could imagine themselves as presidents, surfers, scientists, lawyers, and so much more. In fact, Barbie has had over 250 careers. Handler wanted to inspire and prove to young girls that they could be anything they wanted to be!

As Barbie became more and more popular, the Mattel company added more dolls to their repertoire. In 1961, Ken was introduced as Barbie's on again, off again boyfriend. One could potentially say Barbie's "short term, long distance boyfriend." In 1963, Barbie's best friend Midge was introduced, and so was a little sister named Skipper. In 1967, Barbie went to the A-list and came to resemble various celebrities, with British model Twiggy being the first. During the 80's Barbie not only became more diverse, with African American and Latina Barbie's being introduced, but it went global, with multiple international Barbies being released to the public. In 2016, Barbie expanded to include four different body types, seven skin tones, 22 eye colors and 24 hairstyles. Since 1959, Barbie has had quite the evolution, but Barbie hasn't stopped there. She has come to resemble historical figures, drag queens, cancer patients, and has even dawned the cover of Sports Illustrated. Through Barbie's long and winding history, and despite her flaws, she has become an iconic figure in pop culture, one of the most recognizable to date.



BARBIE MOVIE SUMMARY

Stereotypical Barbie and her high achieving friends live in the seemingly perfect, matriarchal society of Barbieland. The Barbie's hold the most prestigious jobs, they control the government, the supreme court, and create their dream houses perfectly to their liking. Not only do Barbie's live in Barbieland, but so do the Ken's, who are only happy when they are in the presence and light of the Barbie's gaze. In addition, various other discontinued Barbie's live in the dreamland, such as Midge, and the wonderfully awkward Allan. One night at one of Barbie's perfectly choreographed dance parties, Stereotypical Barbie outwardly begins to question her mortality, and overnight she develops bad breath, cellulite, and FLAT FEET. The next day she visits Weird Barbie, a doll whose owner played with her a bit too hard, and inquires about her new ailments. Weird Barbie Tells Stereotypical Barbie she must journey to the real world and discover the girl that is playing with her to set things right. Stereotypical Barbie travels to the Real World, but unbeknownst to her, Ken has tagged along. When the two arrive in Venice Beach, Barbie discovers a world very different from her own. Men catcall her, she is spoken over by men, and women don't hold the typical occupations they do in Barbie Land. Through a series of incidents Barbie and Ken repeatedly get arrested which spurs Barbie's creator company, Mattel to find Barbie and Ken and recapture them. Eventually, Barbie tracks down who she believes to be her owner, a teenage girl named Sasha. While Barbie expects Sasha to greet her with admiration, Sasha does the exact opposite, scrutinizing her for perpetuating unrealistic beauty standards, and even fascism. Meanwhile, Ken is on his own journey, discovering the joys of patriarchy. For the first time in his life, Ken feels respected. He embraces "manly" fashion, trucks, beer, and most importantly, horses.

Barbie is captured by Mattel executives, who try to "put her back in the box," in order to send her back to Barbie Land. Feeling cornered, Barbie escapes and is picked up by Gloria, a Mattel employee and coincidentally Sasha's mother. The two quickly realize that Barbie's ideas of mortality did not come from Sasha at all, but rather Gloria, who has been playing with Sashas old dolls. Barbie concludes that the three of them must return to Barbie Land to set things right. Sasha and Gloria agree, and soon enough they're off. When Barbie, Sasha, and Gloria return to Barbie Land, Barbie is confronted with a very different world than she left it. The Ken's have taken over, establishing "mojo dojo casa houses," and indoctrinating the Barbies into becoming their submissive girlfriends, housewives, and maids. Stereotypical Barbie begins to lose hope until she is met with Weird Barbie, who allows Gloria to give a speech which recognizes women's capabilities and qualities in the real world. The group sets off to deprogram the other Barbies with empowering memories behind the Kens' backs. The mission is a success and the Barbies eventually manipulate the Ken's into petty infighting on the beach, which causes the Kens' to forget their plan to rewrite Barbie Land's constitution.



The Barbies have once again gained power, and a defeated Ken confides in Stereotypical Barbie and recognizes that he hardly knows who he is. Barbie inspires him to discover his own identity without her. In addition the Barbies, now recognizing how oppression feels, decide to reconcile with the faults of their previous society, emphasizing better treatment of the Kens. Barbie, still unsure of her own identity, is confronted by the spirit of Ruth Handler, the creator of Barbie. Ruth shows Barbie the wonderful ups and downs of being a human, including not only the love, but the pain and nostalgia that goes along with living. An incredibly moved Barbie decides that life as a human is a life she wants to live. She returns home with Sasha and Gloria, bidding goodbye to the Barbies' and Kens' of Barbie Land. Dropped off by an encouraging Sasha and Gloria, Barbie closes the film with a universal female experience, by saying "I'm here to see my gynecologist."

CHARACTER LIST

BARBIES

Stereotypical Barbie: She's as beautiful as she is kind. Stereotypical Barbie is known for her charisma, kind nature, dancing skills, fabulous hair, and leader persona. In the original 2023 movie, Stereotypical Barbie is the first Barbie to venture into the Real World, thus she was the first of the girls to discover the system of patriarchy. Due to her experience in the Real World, she has become the natural leader of the rest of the Barbies on their new adventure. Will she be able to keep Ken off of her back? Will she continue her journey of self discovery? Will she be able to successfully inspire the other Barbies? Finally, will she be able to close the rip in the "space toy continuum?"

Ken: She's everything, he's just Ken. Since the "patriarchy incident," in Barbie Land, Ken has been grappling with self discovery in the wake of Barbie returning to the Real World.
